ROSSO COME IL CIELO (RED LIKETHE SKY)

Directed by Cristiano Bortone, 2006, 96 minutes

DRAMA

Rosso come il cielo is a film inspired by the true story of Mirco Mencacci, currently recognized as one of the most gifted and renowned Italian sound editors. In a small Tuscan village in 1971, Mirco, a 10-year-old boy with a passion for cinema, loses his sight after a rifle accidentally fires. The Italian law at that time did not allow blind children to attend public school, so Mirco's parents are forced to send him to a specialized institute in Genoa where, with the aid of an old tape recorder, he learns that by cutting and



splicing tape he is able to create beautiful stories made of sound. This discovery opens a whole new world for Mirco, who regains hope and confidence and gradually begins to motivate his classmates to find their abilities and rediscover their dreams. Co-written and directed by Cristiano Bortone, Rosso come il cielo is the recipient of numerous awards for best film including the David Giovani 2007 award for best director.

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DIECI INVERNI (TEN WINTERS)

Directed by Valerio Mieli, 2009, 90 minutes

It is the winter of 1999 and a water boat crosses the foggy Venetian lagoon. Camilla, a timid 18year-old, arrives from a country town to study Russian literature and notices Silvestro in the crowd at the dock. Silvestro is also 18 and immature, but hides his inexperience behind a naïve cockiness. He also notices Camilla and secretly follows her to her destination.

Their encounter marks the beginning of a 10-year adventure filled with heart-wrenching reunions and missed opportunities. Dieci inverni is the prelude to a love story narrated through 10 winters; each winter is a beautifully crafted window into the lives of two people who grow independently, but always come back to each other.

Dieci inverni represents the debut of Valerio Mieli as a director and shows a unique narrative maturity that won him the David di Donatello award for best new director in 2010.

L'UOMO NERO (THE CEZANNE AFFAIR)

Gabriele Rossetti returns to southern Italy to say a last farewell to his father Ernesto, a former stationmaster in a small town not far from Bari. The old man reawakens in Gabriele memories of his childhood, of his loving, beautiful mother and fun-seeking uncle, of his friends, but also of Ernesto's irascibility and exasperation over his thwarted attempts to follow his artistic ambitions. Throughout his life, Ernesto believed he was destined to become a famous painter and was



willing to sacrifice everything for the sake of his beloved masters, including his own pride. Gabriele was never able to accept this humiliation and was determined to never turn out like his father. Years later, through chance and circumstances, Gabriele begins to understand Ernesto and see what sort of person his father really was.

Conceived as part publicity stunt, part bonding trip, a group of musicians and a reluctant journalist set off on a ten-day trek by foot to cross the region of Basilicata (coast to coast) to reach the Scanzano Jonico Festival where they are scheduled to perform. Along the way, the members encounter an array of unforeseen circumstances and oddball locals that lead them to examine their own personal paths in life and perhaps reconsider what still lies ahead.

"Rome, 1992. What I really want when I die is to have a burial ceremony with only a few people attending - those who took my side in the struggle for justice. I don't want my mother to come, or to visit my grave following my death, absolutely not..."



Rita Mancuso seals these fateful words into the confines of her private diary. On November 5, 1991, this young 17-year-old Sicilian woman goes

to see the anti-Mafia Prosecutor to seek vengeance for the murders of her father and brother, both "Men of Honour" in the Mafia. It is the first time that such a young woman from a family linked to the Mafia breaks the code of silence. From now on, Rita's days are numbered. She has only nine months to live.

GENERAZIONE 1000 EURO (GENERATION 1,000 EUROS)

Directed by Massimo Vernier, 2009, 101 minutes

In this fast-paced romantic comedy, set in bustling Milan, we witness a common Italian dilemma: how to get by on a salary of just 1,000 Euros a month? Matteo, a 30-year-old university graduate, shares a hazard-prone apartment with his best friend and works in the marketing department of a company being "reorganized." The ongoing threat of being fired is soon eclipsed by the arrival of two women in

his life: Angelica, his seductive co-worker, and Beatrice, the new roommate who moves into his apartment, initially much to his annoyance. As they draw him into an endless series of trials and tribulations, Matteo is forced to define his life and figure out what he's really living for. Based on the eponymous novel by Antonio Incorvaia and Alessandro Rimassa (which began as a hit online blog), Generazione 1000 Euro is a comedy about life's many choices - personal and professional, financial and ethical - played out by likable characters who warmly mix ingenuity and optimism.

FORTAPÀSC (FORT APACHE)

Directed by Marco Risi, 2008, 115 minutes

Marco Risi's long-in-gestation Fortapàsc strikingly re-creates the last four months in the life of Giancarlo Siani, a young journalist whacked by the Neapolitan mob in 1985 for digging too deeply into their alliances. Risi has crafted his personal best with this hard-hitting take on the murder of idealism. The title, pronounced "Fort-apash" in dialect, references John Ford's classic western, Fort Apache, and the lawlessness of Mafia-ruled Naples, here brought to life Scorsese-style.



The film was one of five Italian films pre-selected as the Best Foreign Film submission for the 82nd Academy Awards.

L'UOMO CHE VERRÀ (THE MAN WHO WILL COME)

Directed by Giorgio Diritti, 2009, 108 minutes

Winter, 1943. Martina is eight years old and lives on the slopes of Monte Sole, not far from Bologna. She is the only daughter of a peasant family which, like many others in the village, is struggling to survive. Martina had stopped talking after the death of her infant brother years before, but when her mother becomes pregnant again, Martina lives waiting for the baby ("the man") who will come.





In the meantime, the war approaches and life becomes increasingly difficult. The night between October 28 and 29, 1944, when the baby is finally born, the SS unleashes an unprecedented raid that will go down in history as the Marzabotto massacre. A difficult but very important historical event is handled sensitively and tastefully.

This movie is un-rated but contains violent scenes.
