NON ESSERE CATTIVO (DON'T BE BAD)

MODERATOR: Gabriele Angieri is a local stage and film actor, who starred in the locally made film Profile of a Killer, and appears this spring in the Park Square production of Macbeth. He is a first generation Neapolitan from New York City.





Italy's official selection for the 2015 Academy Award for Best Foreign Language Film is a searing crime drama and astute social criticism, the last movie from acclaimed director Claudio Caligari, who died shortly after filming.

In the mid-'90s Ostia, a seaside Roman suburb, best friends Vittorio and Cesare are small-time drug dealers, harmless losers eking out a living and seeking some form of grubby redemption. Vittorio falls for the beautiful Linda, and he tries to take the straight-and-narrow path, but his loyalty to his best friend interferes. When Cesare's ambitions take them in totally different directions, the only outcome is certain disaster.

A hard-hitting and surprisingly emotional crime film, *Non essere cattivo* is an excursion into the darkness of the human soul, featuring stunning performances by its two male leads.

Set in Imola, Bologna, and based on the true story of racer Carlo Capone, director Matteo Rovere's exciting film plunges the viewer into the world of Gran Turismo racing.

Giulia De Martino (newcomer Matilda De Angelis) is a 17-year-old racing prodigy and the pride of her father, who also serves as her coach. But when he dies suddenly, underage Giulia is not legally allowed to look after her younger brother, and her father's debts threaten to destroy her career and leave them homeless.

Enter older brother Loris (Stefano Accorsi), once a premier racer whose addictions have left him reeling. Old enough to satisfy Italian social workers (who want an adult caring for both underage kids), he reluctantly helps train Giulia, who must win the GT championship or lose the family home. Failing a victory, Loris will have to race himself, in the dangerous Veloce come il vento, a legendary rural street race with few rules and many casualties.

Based on a true story, Veloce come il vento was filmed live on actual racetracks and without any special effects. The result is a thrilling and touching movie about determination, family love, and loyalty.

One of Italy's leading comic actresses, Paola Cortellesi, takes a dramatic turn with brilliant success in Massimiliano Bruno's wicked comedy about a woman trying desperately to keep her family together in the face of economic hardship.

Luciana, a factory worker married to the downon-his-luck Stefano (Alessandro Gassman), sees herself as essentially happy. Despite the utter banality of her factory job, she is well liked at work, surrounded by good friends, a loving husband, and, after years of trying, is pregnant with a baby. Things look great, if not financially strained.

But the joy of impending motherhood lasts only a few months, as the factory refuses to renew her contract due to her pregnancy. The loss of her job, and the lack of steady income, puts an enormous strain on Luciana and Stefano, whose money-losing schemes suddenly seem less charming than they did before. Begging for help but with no one to heed her cries, Luciana takes matters into her own hands, with tragic results.

A box office sensation, Lo chiamavano Jeeg Robot is Italy's answer to the superhero film, a stunning examination of crime and morality. Enzo Ceccotti (Claudio Santamaria) is a petty thief trying to eke out a living in Tor Bella Monaca, a Roman slum. Escaping from gang enforcers, he jumps into the Tiber and falls into a barrel of radioactive waste. Barely surviving, he emerges days later with superhuman strength and the ability to heal from any wounds.

Despite this, nothing goes right for our hero, who sees the father of a mentally ill young woman next door get killed in a botched drug deal. The woman, believing him to be Japanese manga hero Steel Jeeg, urges him to do good, and forces Enzo to confront his indifference to the world. Soon, our Jeeg Robot is being hailed as a hero, and is about to have a violent confrontation with a psychotic gangster—who may have fallen into the same waste—known as "The Gipsy".

C'ERA UNA VOLTA IL WEST (ONCE UPON A TIME IN THE WEST)

1968, 175 min.

DIRECTOR: Sergio Leone

MODERATOR: Colin Covert began publishing as a film critic with the late, lamented giveaway the Twin Cities Reader in the late 1970s and for the last 30-plus years he has been at his beat for the Star Tribune, and its myriad newspaper partners.

This year, the Italian Film Festival celebrates one of Italy's greatest directors: Sergio Leone. There is no better way to do this than with a screening of his epic masterpiece, *Once Upon a Time in the West*.

Waiting for his bride to arrive from New Orleans, a landowner is gunned down by thugs hired by a railroad baron who is hungry for the man's land. The new bride, Jill (a radiant Claudia Cardinale), isn't one to shrink from a fight, and seeks revenge on the hired killer Frank (Henry Fonda). But what about Harmonica (Charles Bronson), who also wants Frank killed? And then there's Cheyenne (Jason Robards), a bandit whom Frank framed for murder, who also has designs on revenge.

The complex story was not just conceived by Sergio Leone, but also had input from famed directors Bernardo Bertolucci and Dario Argento. Not simply Leone's masterpiece, Once Upon a Time in the West has been called one of the greatest films ever made, and was selected for preservation as "culturally significant" by the Library of Congress.

LORO DI NAPOLI

This beautiful documentary explores the difficulties facing immigrants in Italy even in something as innocent as football.

Afro-Naples United is one of the most successful amateur soccer teams in Italy. Playing in the northern suburbs of Naples, they are made up of Neapolitans, second generation Italians, and migrants from Africa and South America. But when the founder of Afro-Naples wants his incredibly successful team to compete in the semi-professional league organized by the Italian Soccer Federation, he runs headlong into bureaucracy, myriad laws, and outright racism.

Beatrice (Valeria Bruni Tedeschi) is a wealthy, rebellious, and outrageous personality, committed by her family to a mental institution. Donatella (Micaela Ramazzotti) has survived a suicide attempt that also almost took the life of her child, and is a person who is barely able to hold a conversation. Seeking out a new friend, Beatrice hauls Donatella on a daring escape, seeking to reunite the fragile woman with her child, now adopted to more stable parents.

With rich cinematography that casts this unpredictable story in warm Tuscan sunlight, *Like Crazy* will make you laugh, it will bring tears to your eyes, and will make you question society's notion of sanity and healing.

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
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
